**7. Determine what codes we are researching (there were some questions based on the fact that the State of Iowa adopts a certain NEC and we weren't confident how that impacts our review)**

Cities can require some additional requirements but they can't be less restrictive. This Committee (NEC/IECC) wants to be cautious with recommendations because some cities may move forward with adoption of a new code that could cause some issues with different versions of the code. There was an idea to ask the Iowa Electrical Examining Board to "interpret" certain aspects of the code as opposed to make amendments. There are situations where different cities have different requirement/interpretations of the NEC. An example came up with a service change out. One community may only require the service panel be updated and all else can remain while another community will require further upgrades in the electrical system of the home.

Cities have created individual upgrade requirements that vary for each jurisdiction. There is value in having a common approach that helps the trade on a regional basis. The end result may be of best use for smaller communities that can achieve safer communities. The problem is that communities having inspections conducted by the State of Iowa will likely only enforce the code adopted by the State of Iowa.
